Coach's Report – Team News & Updates

Coach Fields

- Indoor facility status...up and running. It is already being utilized.
- Practice and Qualifying.
 - ➤ Very large program. Each player will get one day of skill building (2 hours), one club day (play at their own at a home course), other days they will play. After September 10th, this will change based on tournament play. Courses played are Indian Creek, Coyote Ridge, and Castle Hills. September 3rd is the last day of qualifying for girls, boys September 9th. There will be checkpoints throughout the year, so placement is fluid. He will look at broad picture of each golfer. September 26th is second checkpoint for girls, October 10th second checkpoint for boys.

- **Carpool:** Please reach out if you have trouble being able to get your golfer to practice and Coach will help work it out.
- **Communication:** The importance of communication was stressed. Discussion needs to stay focused on your golfer and no other players. Please communicate when your golfer will not be at practice.
- **Tournament spectators:** Stay on the cart path away from the players and during warm up, please do not be in practice area with them trying to instruct.
- **Discipline issues:** First minor infraction is a discussion with coach, 2nd is discussion with parent. Possible range running!
- Three things to make a kid successful: good equipment, good instruction, access to a good facility.

Parent Q & A / Adjournment

- ➤ 1st period practice: This will be held for 2 hours and then those players can play on their own after school if desired.
- Player/Coach Interaction: Coaches plan on working with all 42 players as much as possible and want to be a part of all player development.
- Tournament Qualifying factors...Coach explained how he determines each player's eligibility for tournament play. He will put your player in a position where they can be most successful.
- **Tournament transportation**: This will be provided by either bus or suburban.
- Number of players on tournament roster: Typically, 5 players will be taken to each tournament.
